Men and women both worked, and "because ancient Mesopotamia was fundamentally an agrarian society, the principal occupations were growing crops and raising livestock" (Bertman, 274). However, there is one striking difference in the economic structure of Mesopotamia and that of Egypt. The Mesopotamian women were allowed to own wealth under different contexts (McKay et al. 15).
