Named for African American artist Romare Bearden, the one-year paid fellowship is designed to prepare minority graduate students who are pursuing careers as art historians and museum professionals. Fellows gain valuable hands-on experience by working on specific assignments tailored to their background and interests.

In 1977, an exhibition entitled Romare Bearden, Odysseus at Cordier and Ekstrom Gallery in New York, included paintings inspired by classical themes. Taken from the Homeric legends, these paintings incorporated larger and fewer collage elements, flat shapes of objects and people, and emphasized a single color such as blue or green.
